I was especially disappointed to have to cancel the Jubilee when we would have been raising much needed funds for Cornwall Air Ambulance, but I was happy to be able to donate, on behalf of us all, the £554.51 which was raised at last year's event.

I understand that our junior girls might have been disappointed by the fact that the boys were able to go ahead with their County Championships whilst the girls were not. It was a strange situation in that England Golf gave little or no guidance to County Associations and Organisations. Each Association/Organisation was left to make their own decisions which resulted in some going ahead with events and others cancelling events. This led to the situation we had in Cornwall where the men went ahead and the Ladies did not. However, I know the girls have all been playing golf when possible and there have been some impressive handicap reductions. I think they will be a force to be reckoned with at next year's SW Inter Counties event.

I would like to congratulate Emily Toy who put up a strong defence of her Women's Amateur Championship title. After a run of great victories she was defeated in the semi-finals by the eventual champion. Like all of us, Emily's year has been thwarted by cancelled and postponed events. Hopefully some of the events she was scheduled or hoping to play in will come to fruition next year but in the meantime we look forward to following her progress at the US Women's Open in Houston starting on 10th December.

I wish all the best to the county team as they resume their training and matches under the guidance of new Captain Wendy Briggs next year. I would like to thank Wendy for her support and wish her well for the next two years.

This year's SW match week was to have been the first of a new, shorter format so it will be interesting to see how that works out next year. The new shorter format is planned to be more inclusive to working players and will also be less expensive for counties with fewer nights away. National Finals next year will also move to the new shorter format. I thoroughly enjoyed my time spent with the team and was always in awe of the standard and consistency of the golf. In addition to their county matches I wish all the best to individual players as they

make their mark on the national amateur scene. The girls from Cornwall have had some great victories in recent years so long may that continue.

As I complete my term of office I would like to say a huge thank you to the committee. This year has been challenging for everyone and the committee were faced with some big decisions to make. Having put everything in place for a great year of competition both at team level and at handicap level it was of course, so disappointing to have to cancel it all. The committee have been superb!

Jenny Potter always has all our administration in order and is so knowledgeable about any issues which crop up. I'm sure the whole committee were delighted when Jenny agreed to stay in position for a further year.

Jacquie Lang has done a great job for the last three years as competition secretary. We have had well run competitions at venues all around the county. I know Jacquie has everything in place for a smooth handover to Debbie Harmer who will take her place. We are thrilled to welcome Debbie to the committee and I wish her all the best for the next three years. Mo Hammond is doing a great job as treasurer keeping tabs on all our finances. I hope next year she won't have to spend hours refunding entrance fees like she did this year! It has been a pleasure to have Jill Simmons as our President and I was delighted to hear that Jill was happy to extend her term of office.

Mel Nile took over the juniors at a point where there was something of a changing of the guard, with several of a very strong junior team moving out of junior golf. Mel has done a fantastic job nurturing a younger group of girls to the point that we have several junior girls now with a single figure handicap index and they are going from strength to strength.
